

Alberta Community and Co-operative Association Program Conditions and Standards of Behavior

The staff of each camp has the responsibility of providing the best educational program possible. However, the success of the program is equally dependent on the participants assuming mature and responsible behavior while in attendance.

These standards of behaviour include:

1. No **S.A.D.D.S.** (sex, alcohol, drugs, disruptive behaviour, smoking).
2. No one to leave Goldeye Centre without permission from the Youth Program Co-ordinator.
3. No visitors other than family. This **must be approved** by the Youth Program Co-ordinator.
4. Respect other's personal property
 - vehicles are off limits without permission.
 - Goldeye staff residences are off limits.
 - ACCA staff residence is off limits except in emergencies.
5. No girls in guys' cabins and vice versa.
6. Report any health problems, special diet needs, medications or injuries to ACCA Staff.
7. No littering or defacing property.
8. Fire fighting equipment is to be used for fire fighting only.
9. Sweet Charlotte is to be used for:
 - wake up
 - start of sessions
 - emergency signal
10. This is a forest reserve. Tree cutting and open fires are prohibited.
11. **ABSOLUTELY NO SMOKING FOR ANYONE UNDER THE AGE OF 18.** This includes cigarettes, cigars, cigarette papers, e-cigarettes etc. Those who are over 18 are allowed to smoke **ONLY** in designated areas during designated breaks.
12. Report any missing items **IMMEDIATELY**. Large sums of money or jewellery should be checked with staff.
13. Cabin doors must be kept closed.
14. Washrooms must be kept clean.
15. Use good sense when all else fails.
16. Quiet Time is 11:00 p.m. in the forest reserve.
17. *In order to receive the full benefit of the youth program, participants **are NOT** to bring **cell phones** to the ACCA Co-operative Youth Leadership Program. In the event that a participant is caught with a cell phone after they have been asked to turn it in, that participant will be sent home immediately at their own expense.*

Please note: the Youth Program Cell Phone is always available for the participants to call parents if they would like or for parents to call in to the Youth Program. **780-991-4620

General Rules and Guidelines for Participants

In view of the objectives and in consultation with the sponsors and previous seminar participants, the following few general rules and guidelines have been established for the total ACCA Youth Program.

- Chaperones are provided on the buses to and from Goldeye Centre. Participants are responsible for appropriate conduct on the buses. This includes getting off/on the bus **only** at scheduled rest stops or your scheduled departure point.
- Any changes affecting the information on the registration health form previously sent to ACCA must be reported to the Youth Program Co-ordinator upon arrival at Goldeye Centre.
- Program staff accommodations are separate from those of the participants so there may be no supervision in the dormitories. However staff routinely checks on participants. Appropriate conduct by participants is expected.
- Participants will be involved in recreational and sporting activities e.g., waterfront, initiative tasks, etc. which require the use of equipment in a safe manner. Participants are hereby advised that they cannot participate in these activities without the supervision of an ACCA volunteer staff member.
- Respecting the privacy of others will be expected.
- Sponsors and program staff expect a high degree of participation in the seminar.

Please note: If these Standards of Behaviour are not met, participants will be sent home at their expense and will be required to repay the sponsor's portion.
